Mountain Lion Ecology and Research in Colorado

Presented by: Dr. Don Hunter and Caroline Krumm, Director Rocky Mountain Cat Conservancy

As Colorado's top predator, mountain lions play an important role in ecosystem dynamics, helping regulate deer and elk populations. As efficient carnivores, they occasionally pose a threat to humans. Human-mountain lion encounters are on the rise throughout the west. Given the growth projections for the Front Range, available habitat for mountain lions will continue to shrink. Under these conditions, can mountain lions coexist with humans? What can be done to mitigate the future loss of mountain lion habitat? How can communities become involved in mountain lion management and conservation? This presentation will focus on these and other issues that center upon human and mountain lion coexistence. Presenters Don Hunter and Caroline Krumm study mountain lions in Rocky Mountain National Park and the Northern Front Range. They will share what they have learned over the past six years about mountain lions and what the future might look like with community support and engagement. Their talk will also include a new, citizen-based approach to mountain lion conservation that has been very successful in Estes Park and will soon come to Fort Collins. Hunter and Krumm started the Rocky Mountain Cat Conservancy in 2008 as a non-government non-profit



organization dedicated to wild cat conservation worldwide. For more information visit their website: http://www.catconservancy.org/.


